## **Key Messages**

- Don't wait. The deadline to apply for FEMA assistance is Saturday, March 8.
- Disaster Recovery Centers offer face-to-face help with FEMA applications, appeals and other recovery resources.

- Make sure FEMA can reach you. Phone calls may come from unfamiliar numbers and Area Codes. FEMA may need more information to continue processing your application.

## **Update**

- \$396.9 million approved for **156,968** households, including money for rent, basic home repairs and other disaster-caused needs.
- **\$405 million** in Public Assistance funding approved to support community recovery.
- \$144.1 million disbursed by the U.S. Small Business Administration in low-interest disaster loans.
- 13,294 households have stayed in FEMA-paid hotel rooms (Transitional Sheltering Assistance).
  - o As of March 5, **1,884** households remained.
- 181 households are living in FEMA temporary housing units.
- 3,713 households have received rental assistance.
- 6,230 families have received \$18.3 million for repair or replacement of private-access roads and bridges.
- 5 million cubic yards of debris has been cleared from public rights of ways, 3.7 million by state contractors and
  1.4 million by federal contractors.
- The waterway debris mission has removed 685,689 cubic yards of debris: approximately 631,200 by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and 54,500 by state contractors.
- \$52.4 million in disaster unemployment benefits have been provided to applicants.
- \$157.8 million paid in claims by the National Flood Insurance Program.
